Pursuing Ambitious Sustainability Policy in Tough Times

With more than 300 participants, 52 sessions, transdisciplinary exchange and artistic interventions, the RIFS conference Tough Conversations in Tough Times (December 3-5) brought together experts from academia, civil society, policymaking and the field. Over three days, participants explored the growing opposition to ambitious sustainability policies and possible responses to the changing landscape of public debate. The focus of discussions ranged from democratic innovations and sustainable consumption to the impact of artificial intelligence on the transformation towards sustainability.

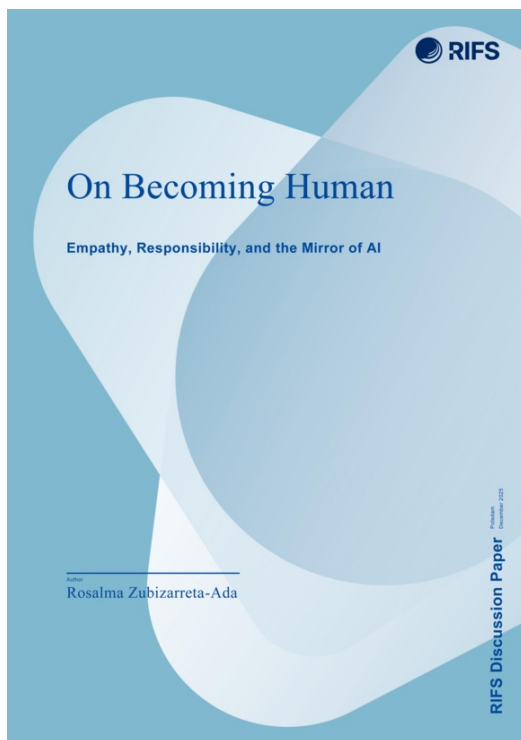

Systemic Risk Governance for Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Adaptation

Climate change adaptation is a top priority worldwide and is closely linked to the ongoing development of risk management approaches. For the open-access book "Adapting to Climate Change. Implications of Risk-Based Approaches", researchers from the Research Institute for Sustainability (RIFS) contributed a chapter on innovations in climate change and disaster risk management. Drawing on recent findings from a European research project, the chapter illustrates how innovations can enhance resilience, bridge local and systemic perspectives, and support continuous learning in risk governance.

Developing Roadmaps to Scalable Carbon Dioxide Removal by Enhanced Silicate Weathering (RESET)

The EU has set itself the goal of becoming climate neutral by 2050. To achieve this, it is not enough to drastically reduce CO₂ emissions; CO₂ must also be removed from the atmosphere. In the RESET project, researchers are investigating how Enhanced Weathering of silicate rock can permanently remove CO₂ from the atmosphere.

RIFS Conference 2025: Keynote by Jürgen Trittin

In his keynote speech at the first RIFS conference, Jürgen Trittin, former Federal German Minister for the Environment and long-standing politician with Alliance 90/The Greens, analysed the development of the climate debate from broad consensus to deep polarisation. He opened with the provocative question of whether there was an "end of reason". He then explained that the climate debate is now dominated by a well-organised minority who deliberately stir up fears and deny facts. This group, supported by the fossil fuel lobby, uses the media, social media algorithms and populist rhetoric to divide the public.
